MS. GANSLE: This public hearing is being held by order of the Town Board pursuant to Section 202b of the New York State Town Law in relation to Mohawk View Water Pollution Control Plant Generator and Building Improvements Roof Access Ladder Project.

Notice of the public hearing has been published in the official own newspaper which is the Spotlight and has been posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board. I have an affidavit for each. The Town Board will now hear all persons interested in this project.

MS. PECK: Good evening. My name is Crystal Peck and I serve as special counsel to the division of Pure Waters. The project before the Board tonight relates to a roof access and letter project of the Mohawk View Water Pollution Control Plant.

In 2017 Barton and Loguidice, engineers retained by the Town, performed a complete evaluation of the generator and improvements required for the plant. The evaluation is offering several recommendations, most of which included deferments that were part of a 2017 project. While the roof access letters were recommended, they were not included in the bid awarded in the 2017 project. In order to ensure safe access to the building roofs, it is now recommended and requested that the Town allocate funds to improve the roof access ladder

project.

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The maximum amount estimated for this project is \$56,500. It is estimated that the project will increase the annual debt service for the Division of Pure Waters by \$2,883. There will be no increase to operation maintenance costs. It is anticipated that an increase in debt service will result in.08 cent increase in the 2019 assessed value of a typical single-family residential home.

I can answer any questions of the Board or the public may have.

SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Does the Board have any questions on this?

MS. WHALEN: I know upstairs you said that you were going to say something about the annual debt service.

MS. PECK: Yes, the project is anticipated to increase the annual debt service by \$2,883 and that increase is the assessed value of a typical single-family home by 0.8 cents.

MS. WHALEN: Thank you.

SUPERVISOR MAHAN: And that's a capital project.

MS. PECK: It is a capital project.

SUPERVISOR MAHAN: And does the audience have any questions?
