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MS. GANSLE: This public hearing is being held by order of the Town Board to hear all persons in connection to a proposed Local Law amending the Code of the Town of Colonie, Chapter 181 entitled Vehicles & Traffic codification by amending Schedule VII - "Speed Limit".

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Notice of the public hearing has been published in the official Town newspaper which is the Spotlight and has been posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board. I have an affidavit for each. The Town Board will now hear all persons interested in this matter.

MR. MAGGUILLI: This matter comes on at the request of the residents that live along the affected portions of Boght Road. What this Resolution will do is amend Chapter 181 of the Town Code and reduce the speed limit which is currently set at 40 miles per hour for a distance of approximately 1.7 miles on Boght Road between Elm Street and St. Agnes Highway and by default, reduce that to 30 miles per hour.

SUPERVISOR MAHAN: The consensus came up that 30 would be appropriate. We've had several members of our Police Department take a look at it and we've had a lot of feedback from residents that live in the area. It actually will blend in better with those that are near

there that are 30 miles an hour.

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Does the Board have any questions?

MR. CAREY: I think that there might be some people in the audience that might want to speak about this. I talked to some of the residents on Saturday.

MR. FELTT: Hi, my name is Carlos Feltt and I live at 324 Boght Road and I have been there for 32 years, so I've seen the changes on Boght Road. I'm the one that went around and collected signatures. Out of all the people that I talked to on or right off of Boght Road, there was only one person who said no, that they didn't want it lowered. They all had stories and that's what kept me going and trying to get it to the Town Board because there are so many things — either accidents or near-misses. There are several people that used to walk around there and they won't walk on Boght Road anymore because the cars are just too fast. They are not going 40 miles per hour.

A lot of these people here are from Boght Road and I think that they all support it. I appreciate the Town taking the time and bringing it up for a vote. Thank you.

SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Thank you, very much.

Anyone else?

MS. CUMELLA: My name is Rosemarie Cumella. My

husband, Charles Cumella, live at 204 Boght Road. I am a self-proprietor of New York State small daycare at 204. It's been a real issue there for the safety of the kids and the parents and the bus drivers. Everybody has complained a lot in light of the safety of getting off the bus. The bus drivers don't want to feel like people are going to ram in behind them. Parents are concerned about getting in and out of the driveway and I'm concerned about getting my mail because I have to cross the street. So, it's really been a very difficult time. I even bought a sign that says slow down. People see the sign and they speed up. So, it really has been a very difficult thing.

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SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Thank you. As I said, we listened to the feedback that we got and it was reviewed very carefully. I think that everyone was comfortable with it.

There is also an enforcement factor.

Unfortunately, if it's 40, people go 48 or 50. With 30, there is a big difference of 10 miles an hour.

Enforcement opportunities, I think, will be better, if needed. Hopefully - we just want people to slow down.

So, I'm comfortable with the information that I received from our PD and our highway people. I don't know if anybody has any other comments.

MR. MAGGUILLI: The only thing that I would like to add is that if this gets adopted tonight, by law, we have to file this amendment to our Local Law with the New York State Secretary of State. It doesn't technically become effective until we get the filing receipt from the New York State Secretary of State. So, it may be a couple of weeks before you actually see the signs change, if it's adopted. It's not the Town dragging its feet, it's just what we have to do to comply with the new York State Law. I assure you that once we get the receipt back from the secretary of state, we will get our highway people out there to

MS. LICAUS: Thank you all, so much. A few weeks seems like a drop in the bucket compared to how long we have been waiting for this to happen. We have lived at 261 Boght Road for 11 years now. I am a part of four generations that have lived on Boght Road and it's posted 40 but people think 50 and more. I brought my two reasons why I think that road should be lowered to 30 and we do walk on that road. It is like a drag-strip. For most people there is a lot of cars flying by. There are deer on the road. There are young kids on the road and people trying to walk. It's a residential area.

When we moved in 110 years ago and I talked

to the Town, one of the Police Officers asked how fast is too fast? In my opinion, 41 miles an hour is too fast. It just keeps getting more populated and they are going faster and faster. So, we also asked if there could be those signs that say children at play and the officer also told me that no, people who drive through that area should know that it's a residential area and they don't need a children at play sign.

People don't know and they drive recklessly.

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We were in an accident in January of 2014, passed on the double-yellow line and the driver was ticketed on the scene with drugs and alcohol while driving - the person who hit us. Thank goodness that our child at the time was not in the car with us. It's just really important that we have it lowered and with more developing and more traffic it would just be important to the people and the families that live on that road. So, thank you for hearing us.

Thank you so much to Carlos and Bev who worked really hard going door to door and rallying all of us because it's really important to our community. Thank you for all of their hard work and thank you for hearing us out at the meeting.

MR. ROSANO: I have just one quick question for the neighbors. I've been on the Town Board for almost

eight years and this is really in my area. This is the first time that I have heard about this on the Town Board. Now, you may have approached the police, but I have no record of you coming to the Town Board for this.

MS. LICAUS: It was through the police.

MR. ROSANO: So, we didn't drop the ball up here because we didn't know about it.

MS. LICAUS: No.

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MR. ROSANO: Okay, I just want to be clear on that. We act on these things instantly all the time.

Okay, thank you.

SUPERVISOR MAHAN: I think that it's logical too because many farms were there in the past. It was more of a country road. It's a thing of the past. Most of the farmers are all retired and sold their land for homes. It goes along with adapting to the changes.

Anyone else?

MS. JEFFERS-VONDOLLEN: I will say that I lived on that road. My mother still lives there. She's in the back. She's coincidentally here for the Board meeting. I used to run on Boght Road from Howansky up on Boght Road and try to go into Windrose and back through. I would run with my little Jack Russell Terrier and I stopped running with him because just the way that the cars were going too fast and I know I said that at our agenda

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1	session two weeks ago that I felt the same way. It was
2	getting a little out of control with the way that people
3	were driving all over 50 miles an hour or so. I can
4	definitely sympathize with what's going on and I'm glad
5	that everyone is on board with changing that.
6	SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Okay, we have to close the
7	public hearing before we can vote. So, we will do that
8	now.
