And whereas the Members of the Colonie Town Board find that the men and women of the Colonie Police Department wear their uniforms with honor, dedication and integrity as they protect and defend this community and the people of Colonie;

And whereas in November 2009 and again in November 2010 CQ Press formally known as Morgan Quitno Publishing ranks the Town of Colonie with the lowest crime rate of all communities in the United States with a population of at least 75,000 residents and has since continually ranked the Town of Colonie at the top 10 or better for having the lowest crime rate of all communities in the United States with a population of at least 75,000 residents due largely to the efforts to the Colonie Police Department;

And whereas the success is largely attributed to the leadership of the department by Chief Jonathon Teale and Deputy Chief Michael Woods, leaders who have been recognized for the professionalism service and dedication to the department, the community and the profession. It is also attributed to the efforts dedication and professionalism of the men and women of the Colonie Police Department;

Whereas Chief Teale and Deputy Chief Woods working in partnership with this Town Board has ensured that the members of the department are properly trained and equipped and evaluated to ensure that they are able to serve and protect this community with honor, and dignity, professionalism, safety and respect.

Now therefore be it resolved that the

Town Board of the Town of Colonie and the Town Attorney hereby affirms and also I should say and we have tonight with us, as always, our Town Clerk Julie Gansle and Michelle Turcotte, Deputy Town Clerk as well - we are all here to publicly acknowledge our support for all of the men and women of the Colonie Police Department.
