1 MS. GANSLE: This public hearing is being held by
2 order of the Town Board pursuant to Section 202b of the
3 Town Law of the State of New York in relation to the
4 Albany Shaker Road Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation
5 Project.

6 Notice the public hearing has been published in the
7 official Town newspaper which is the Spotlight and has
8 been posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board. I have
9 an affidavit for each. The Town Board will now hear all
10 persons interested in this project.

11 MS. PECK: Good evening, my name is Crystal Peck
12 and I serve as special District Council for the Town of
13 Colonie.

14 The project before the Board tonight is a capital
15 project to rehabilitate the Albany Shaker Road gravity
16 sewer. The Town owns and operates in extensive sewer
17 collection system in the southern section of the Albany
18 Shaker Road. The gravity sewer system was originally
19 installed between 1967 and 1971.

20 The gravity sewer runs along Albany Shaker Road
21 through the Anthony Lane development, crosses Osborne
22 Road and runs parallel to Sand Creek ending at Colling
23 Drive.

24 Due to a history of pipe collapses, closed circuit
25 televised inspections were conducted which revealed

1 multiple pipe defects. As such, it is now recommended
2 that the Town Board approved this project which will
3 include rehabilitation of over 4,900 lineal feet of
4 sewer pipe and restoration of over 18 manholes. The
5 maximum amount proposed for this project is \$998,200.

6 Assuming the project is funded through a 30-year
7 bond with a 3% annual interest rate, the sewer charge
8 for a typical single-family residential property would
9 increase by this project by \$1.40.

10 If the Board has any questions, I would be happy to
11 answer them.

12 SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Does the Board have any further
13 questions on this? This is a major project that needs
14 to be done.

15 (There was a response.)

16 Any questions from the audience?

17 (There was no response.)

18 We will close the public hearing.

19 MS. GANSLE: We have a Resolution pursuant to
20 Section 202b of the Town Law of the State of New York
21 approving the Albany-Shaker Road Sanitary Sewer
22 Rehabilitation Project.

23 MR. ROSANO: So moved.

24 MS. WHALEN: Second.

25 SUPERVISOR MAHAN: Supervisor votes aye. Clerk,
